#### **Training:**

The last 12 months have been busy ones for the NEJS.

We joined up with the Yorkshire and NW junior squads to train with them in the South Lakes at the end of March 2025. Following a similar format to the Kildale training we spent Saturday refining O skills at Graythwaite, before competing at the National Event at Great Tower on the Sunday. The juniors did really well to cope with such technical areas.



We have also been offering 'geeking' sessions before major events. This consists of an online Teams session where we look at the previous map and area in general on google maps. The juniors seem to enjoy this and it seems to focus them.

#### Junior map-making course:

In the summer holidays Phillip Batts of CLOK kindly offered juniors in the region a 3-day course on map-making in OCAD. This took part in late August and was attended by 7 of our juniors. It was an intense course and provided them with lots of skills to further develop if they wish to do so.



## Success:

Two members attended summer training camps – TP went to Lagganlia and got a glowing report. BM attended Stockholm and thoroughly enjoyed the camp.

As well as competing, our juniors are very good at helping out at events too – WR & BM are both enthusiastic planners and the others regularly help out at local events, running the start or the maze, and collecting controls.

## JIRCS 2025 - South lakes:

Last month we travelled to the South Lakes for the Junior Inter Regional Championships. We took 8 juniors (min age 12) to Ulverston High School for this event. The individual was held at Torver Beck Common and the relays were at Haverigg sand dunes. The girls team came a very respectable 7<sup>th</sup> out of 12 in the individual and 8<sup>th</sup> counting team in the relays. Overall in the joint competition NEJS came 9<sup>th</sup>.
